## The Irish and New Year's Traditions

Throughout the centuries, the Irish people have celebrated the dawn of each New Year in a series of special ways. Originally, the New Year was rung in during the end of October, during the Pagan festivals of Samhain. Over time, Ireland converted to Christianity, and this hallowed date followed annual Christmas celebrations instead. In the past, the front door would also be left unlocked, perhaps to allow spirits to move freely in and out of the home.

Irish families will take pains to clean their homes meticulously, in the hopes that this immaculate environment will bring good fortune in the months ahead.
